- Retrofitting Infant Jesus School on Crown Street
 - \$2.7M grant awarded of \$4.5M needed
 - Level 1: Common area; Levels 2 & 3: will accommodate 12 families each
 - Hope for completion by the end of February
- They're welcoming small groups for tours, to raise awareness of needs & resources
- FP holding a NEW coat (no used coats accepted due to COVID) drive
