Sam will release a draft of the zoning code changes on nashuarecode.com this month... and organize public engagement sessions on the new zoning code, including informal office hours and structured evening/weekend sessions. City officials to begin formal adoption process for new zoning code through Board of Aldermen and Planning Board once community feedback is incorporated.
